1. Recognize the ethical problem and apply the CPE program during the current CPE 20 program.

15. Recognize confidentiality requirements to the accounting profession.

16. Determine those events that must be provided to clients, agents, and other stakeholders and customers.

17. Identify principles and non-principles CPE has used.
